PROJECT UPDATES

Aventura Palms Home Development by GHA





Construction is in full swing for 34 brand-new single-family homes at the Aventura Palms Residential Development, perfectly situated at Palm Drive and Camino Aventura. Fresh, vibrant housing options coming to the area!

Skyborne Village Home Development by Lennar





Progress is happening! 286 brand-new singlefamily homes are rising at the Skyborne Residential Development Village 3, nestled at Pierson Boulevard and Karen Avenue.

Rancho Descanso Home Development by Lennar



Rancho Descanso, a new community of singlefamily homes located near the intersection of Palm Drive is now selling!

Construction of 76 homes is underway, and model homes are now open for public tours.









AMAZON WAREHOUSE UPDATE

Construction is underway for a new 700,000+ square foot industrial warehouse building located along 20th Avenue, east of Indian Canyon Drive.

The project is expected to be completed by September 2025. This new facility will play a key role in expanding Amazon's operations and support the growing demand in the region.







Construction is underway for the new 9,000+ square foot Fire Station 98, located at the corner of Hacienda Avenue and Long Canyon Drive. The project is progressing well and is expected to be completed by Summer 2025.

This new facility will enhance emergency response capabilities and improve services for the community.





PROJECTS FLOWING IN SOON!

Eagles Sports Park



Big things are happening at Eagles Sports Park!



Plans for a brand-new 7.5-acre park are moving forward, featuring a football field, baseball field, concession area, and plenty of onsite parking.

The project is currently in the plan check process, and we're thrilled to announce that construction is set to begin in Summer 2025!

This park is sure to be a fantastic addition to the community, offering more opportunities for sports and recreation.

Exciting Community Improvement Projects Underway!

Our city is growing, and several key projects are set to enhance public safety, transportation, and infrastructure.

Here's a look at what's coming soon:

Police Department Annex Building Project

A new 6,000+ square-foot Police Department Annex will soon be under construction! This facility will support local law enforcement and enhance public safety. Construction begins in March 2025, with a groundbreaking ceremony scheduled for March 25th.

Hacienda Avenue Street Improvement Project (Phase 1)

Major upgrades coming to Hacienda Avenue! This project will bring 10,000 linear feet of sidewalk, ADA-accessible driveways, a new bike lane, parkway landscaping, 39 new streetlights, ADA ramps, and striped crosswalks. Construction is set to begin soon, with a groundbreaking ceremony on April 2nd.

Desert Gateway Project

The anticipated Desert Gateway project is set to begin! This 1 million square-foot industrial warehouse will be built on 20th Avenue, east of Indian Canyon Drive and west of the Amazon project. With permits issued, construction will begin soon, marking a major milestone in our city's growth.

Palm Drive Improvements (Camino Aventura to I-10)

Exciting changes are planned for Palm Drive! This project will introduce new sidewalks, bike lanes, and streetlights, improving safety and accessibility. Currently in the plan check process, construction is expected to start in Fall 2025.

New Traffic Signal at Palm Drive & 20th Avenue

A new traffic signal is coming to Palm Drive and 20th Avenue to improve traffic flow and safety. This project is in the plan check phase, with construction set to begin in Fall 2025.

Hacienda Avenue Street Improvements - Tamar Drive to Long Canyon Road (Phase 2)

Phase 2 of the Hacienda Avenue includes sidewalks with ADA-accessible driveways, bike lanes, landscaped medians, streetlights, and ADA ramps. Currently in the engineering design phase, construction is planned for 2026.

Beyond Gas Station

A new gas station is coming to the northwest corner of Pierson Boulevard and Indian Canyon Drive! While construction hasn't started yet, entitlements are approved, and the project is moving forward.

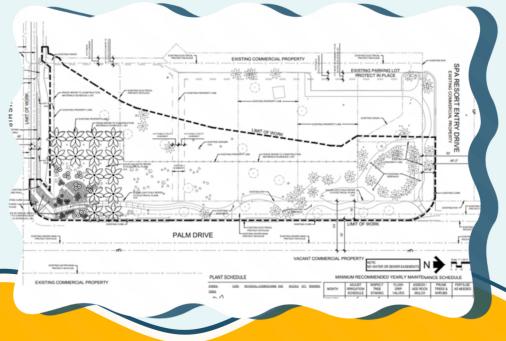
Soluna Hotel Renovation

- * 45 work orders were successfully finished, addressing various public infrastructure needs.
- * 57 plan checks were approved, contributing to ongoing projects and development.

Case Highlight: Successful Case Closure

Compliance Officer Human successfully closed a long-standing case for a single-family home abandoned since 2014.

The property had become a hotspot for break-ins and dumping. Sold to an investment group in January 2025, the new owner has since made significant improvements, including new plumbing, electrical systems, a roof, landscaping, and more. City departments worked together to help bring the property back into compliance. The transformation, from 2022 to now, is impressive.

CASE HIGHLIGHT

Officer Human's Successful Compliance Effort

In August 2021, Officer Human opened a case following a structure fire that caused significant damage to one of the units in a multi-family residential property. Despite her diligent enforcement efforts, the property owner remained unresponsive and uncommunicative. During this period, the owner decided to put the property up for sale.

As the property changed hands, the City began discussions with the new buyer, aiming to establish an agreement that would address the violations left unresolved by the previous owner. The new owner signed a buyer's agreement, and as a result, all violations were resolved.

The before-and-after photos showcase the ongoing efforts and hard work put in by Officer Human to bring this property back into compliance, ensuring a safer and well-maintained living environment for all residents. This case highlights Officer Human's persistence and dedication in restoring property standards, ultimately achieving a successful resolution.

CASE HIGHLIGHT Supervisor Messer's Successful Resolution of

Longstanding Code Compliance Issues

Supervisor Messer recently closed a longstanding Code Compliance case involving a single-family residential property that had posed ongoing challenges for the community and surrounding areas. Over the years, the property had been reported multiple times for illegal construction, the accumulation of trash and junk, and safety hazards resulting from a structural fire that compromised the building's integrity.

Despite the persistent issues, Supervisor Messer remained dedicated to enforcing compliance, sending numerous notices to the property owner over the years. After years of neglect, the property was eventually sold to a company specializing in repairing and rehabilitating distressed properties. The new owner took immediate action, obtaining all necessary building permits and addressing all outstanding violations.

The before-and-after photos highlight the significant transformation of the property, showcasing Supervisor Messer's persistence and the positive impact of diligent Code enforcement. This case underscores the importance of continued effort in improving the safety and quality of life for the community.
